- **#Basis: EUROGI consultation paper: Towards a** GI strategy for Europe, October 2000
- #Funded timeframe: 1st November 2001 to the end 2003
- **#**Aim: Develop a cohesive Geographic Information Strategy at the European level
- #Members very much involved e.g. in WS
- **#GINIE** and INSPIRE complement and support each other



- ## Develop a sound knowledge base through the comparative policy analysis of frameworks for access, use, and dissemination of GI
- Raise awareness and capacity building which includes targeted actions for policy-makers at national and European levels
- ## Strategic input to INSPIRE and contributing to the international debate at the GSDI-6 Conference (Budapest, Sept. 2002)
